Business Arising – Updates

- Hall and Park Committee have now taken over the Hall bookings.
- Outcome of the meeting with BCSC re parking at the Hall: council cannot fund this work but have given permission to the Rhyll community to install an indented carpark for 4 cars one of which is for the disabled in front of the Hall with a path leading up to the Hall and earthworks to level off the ground immediately alongside of the Hall, so that seating can be accommodated.
- Master Plan for Rhyll Park: Peter Balfe will work with the relevant community groups and the future needs of the Rhyll Community.
- Resilient Community- Justin from BCSC agreed that Rhyll Hall could be a community refuge when needed. Relevant officer is being hired.
